2. So now, let's work with grammar. We use a causative verb when we want to talk about something that someone else did for us or for another person. It means that the subject caused the action to happen, but didn't do it themselves. Maybe they paid, or asked, or persuaded the other person to do it. For example, we can say:

- I cleaned my house. (This means I cleaned it myself).

But, another way is to use a causative construction. So I can also say:

- I had my house cleaned.

Have + object + past participle (have something done)

- I had my car washed.
- John will have his house painted.

Get + object + past participle (get something done)

- I'll get my hair cut next week.
- He got his washing machine fixed.
